Brief Summary	Inaugural Session
	The seminar on 'DISRUPTED GLOBAL RECOVERY AND ITS IMPACT ON INDIAN ECONOMY' was held in the Patankar Hall of SMRK-BK-AK-Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Nashik on 06 th Feb 2023. All the guests were welcomed by the students and a documentary on Gokhale education Society was shown, which was followed by a welcome song and the University song sung by the students of the college's Department of Music. This was followed by a brief introduction to the seminar by Professor Dr. Nitin Songirkar, the organizing secretary of the seminar and Co-ordinator, Faculty of Commerce and Management. Director of the seminar Principal Dr. Mrs. Deepti Deshpande then introduced the chief guests and other dignitaries, who were formally welcomed with a bouquet. Vice-principals Prof Dr Kavita Patil and Dr Mrs Neelam Bokil, and the Convener of the

seminar Dr Ashlesha Kulkarni were also present on the stage.

The Chief Guest Mr Vishwas Thakur, founder chairman of Vishwas Co-operative Bank Ltd, Nashik then released the e-proceedings of the seminar. Prof. Jayant Bhatambrekar introduced the Chief Guest Mr Vishwas Thakur in a greater detail and then the Chief Guest proceeded to give his address in which he spoke about the co-operative movement, focussing especially on co-operative banking. This was followed by the presidential address by Sir Dr M S Gosavi. This inaugural function ended with a vote of thanks by Professor Dr Mahendra Dhondagepatil, Head of the Department of Accountancy.

SEMINAR:

The core part of the whole seminar was divided into three technical sessions.

The first session had for theme 'Repercussions of the Pandemic on the Indian IT Industry.' The session was co-ordinated by Mrs Vaishali Gaikwad and was chaired by Mr Akshay Deshpande, a budding entrepreneur in 3-D printing technology. Dr Mrs Aurangabadkar was the first presenter who spoke in detail about the service sector and Indian policies about it. Vice Principal Prof Mrs Kavita Patil formally introduced Mr Akshay Deshpande, who then spoke on the session's theme focussing on both the negative and positive effects of the pandemic on the Indian IT industry. The talk ended with a question-answer session.

The second session was themed 'Aftermath of Pandemic on Entrepreneurs' and was co-ordinated by Mrs Vaishali Chaudhary, who introduced the chief speaker of the session Mr Santosh Mandlecha, former Chairman, Maharashtra Chamber of Commerce. In his speech, Mr Mandlecha spoke extensively on effects of the pandemic on manufacturing, services, transport, food, health, entertainment, technology, and many other aspects of the industry, and also took a review of the measures taken by the government through creating new infrastructures. The talk was followed by a question-answer session, and the session ended with Dr Mrs Sunita Ranate of Bytco College, Nashikroad presenting a paper on the effects of the pandemic on the

education field and the related stakeholders.

The theme of the third and final session was 'Opportunities and Challenges of Education Institutes after Pandemic' and was coordinated by Mrs Vaishali Gaikwad. The chief speaker of the session was Dr Mrs Sandhya Khedekar, Principal, College of Education, Sangamner. Dr Khedekar focussed more on the opportunities and positives offered by the pandemic times. This was followed by Prof Praneta Nikumbh and her former student Ms Samruddhi Aher's paper on 'A Study of the Impact of Work Life Balance on Job Stress on Employees of WNS Post Covid' presented by Ms.Samrudhhi Aher.

The final session was followed by the Valedictory Function where the Chief Guest was Principal Dr Ram Kulkarni, Zonal Secretary, G E Society, and was presided over by Dr Mrs Neelam Bokil, Vice Principal, SMRK-BK-AK-Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Nashik. The Chief Guest was welcomed and felicitated by Dr Mrs Neelam Bokil. Professor Dr Nitin Songirkar then welcomed and felicitated Dr Mrs Neelam Bokil. Dr. Chetan Deshmane presented the report of National Seminar. Dr. Jayashri Kadam and Dr. Anup Mohadkar shared their feedback.Principal Dr.Ram Kulkarni appreciated theme related models created by students. He also expressed satisfaction regarding the smooth conduct of National Seminar. He said that disrupted global recovery may be slow, but if the proper direction is given by the government agency ,certainly everyone will be benefitted.
