<b>Brief Summary</b>	<p>Human Development Department of S.M.R.K. B.K. A.K. Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Nashik organized weeklong workshop on 'Creative Dramatics' under the subjects "Early Childhood Education-II and Community Development Program" from 15<sup>th</sup> July 2024 to 19<sup>th</sup> July 2024. The workshop was organized under the guidance of Ms. Sangita Kamble Head of Human Development Department. Mrs. Priyadarshani Kulkarni helped in management of whole program. The workshop was organized for the 12 students of T.Y. B.Sc. Human Development Department.</p> <p>On the first day, the resource person, Miss Prajakta Mengar, gave an introduction to the basics of dramatisation and skit composition. The topics of her lesson were creating scripts, story framing, and using dramatics to make stories come to life. Additionally, participants were taught the significance of the five C's: cooperation, curiosity, creativity, communication, and confidence. These are fundamental ideas that support young children's learning as well as their personal development. Prajkata Bukane introduced the resource person, Vaishnavi Sonawane served as the anchor and Ruksar Shaikh gave the vote of thanks. Overall, the session was well-organised, Today's attendance and feedback were overseen by Ranjana Gavit.</p> <p>Ms. Nishi Shah ma'am led a workshop on instructional strategies in early childhood education and readiness on the second</p>

day. This webinar focused on how teachers might use activity-based learning strategies and readiness assessments to help young children get ready for learning. She shared insightful ideas about how to keep discipline and creativity in preschool settings balanced in the classroom. The resource person was introduced by Apeksha Mali, who served as the session's anchor. Sakshi Thete offered the vote of gratitude. The session was warmly appreciated.

There were two sessions on the third day. Dr. Sayali Acharya ma'am conducted a workshop on framing poems and stories for preschool education in the morning. Her area of expertise was creating captivating narratives and other types of content for young readers. In order to assist educators in creating straightforward yet captivating visual teaching resources, she also covered fundamental principles of filmmaking. Mrs. Chhaya Lokhande presented Content Creation Techniques for News and Media in the afternoon. During this session, participants learnt how to create media content that might simplify current events for young audiences and write news for young audiences. Aditi Kharote and Shreya Mundada led both lively and informative sessions, while Tanvi Palde, Vaishnavi Sonawane, Ranjana Gavit, and Radhika Kulkarni handled the introductions and vote of thanks, respectively.

Mrs. Manisha Joshi, Head of Computer Dept. gave an introduction to the attendees on the fourth day regarding the use of AI in the creation of kid-friendly digital content. She gave an example of how teachers may develop visually appealing instructional materials, such presentations and logos, that are suited for preschoolers by using AI-driven platforms like Canva and Renderforest. During the course, participants created digital content themselves as a way to put what they had learnt into practice. The session was introduced by Harshada Aher, Tanvi Palde gave the vote of thanks, and Ruksar Shaikh served as the anchor. Radhika Kulkarni took pictures and videos during the session.

The purpose of the Creative Dramatics Workshop, which was to improve participants' comprehension of creative dramatics in preschool education, was successfully accomplished. The course gave participants insightful knowledge on writing skits, producing material, and utilizing AI tools to produce instructional content. The workshop attendees departed with enhanced abilities in instructional techniques, digital content development, and classroom management. These proficiencies are imperative for cultivating an engrossing and vibrant learning milieu for young learners.
